Can you imagine how much food it takes to keep them all healthy and fit? The answer is that we have a food delivery once every 18 days and we need 185 x 15 kilo bags of food. That's 2775 kilos of food every 18 days which is 4625 kilos per month.

That costs us a great deal of money which is why if you can help us we desperately need your donations.
